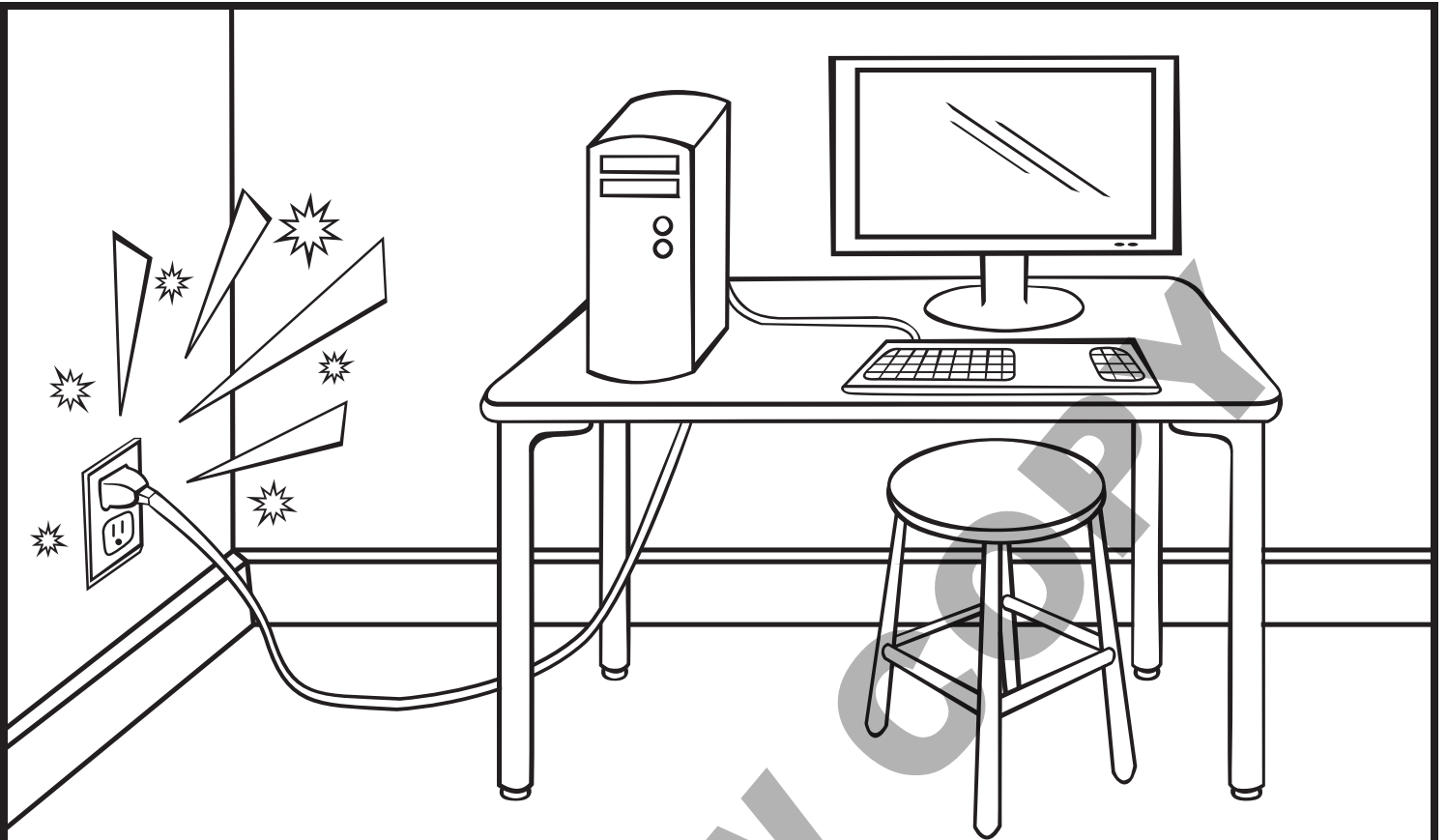

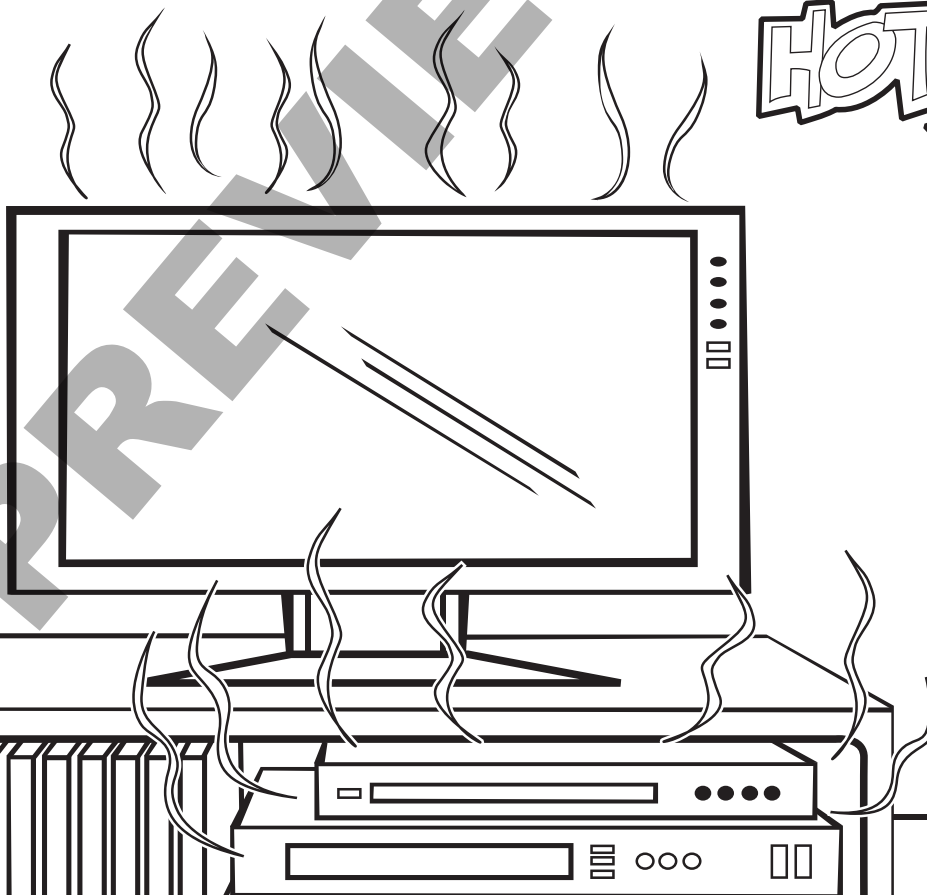
**When you see sparks,

**HOT SPOTS!**

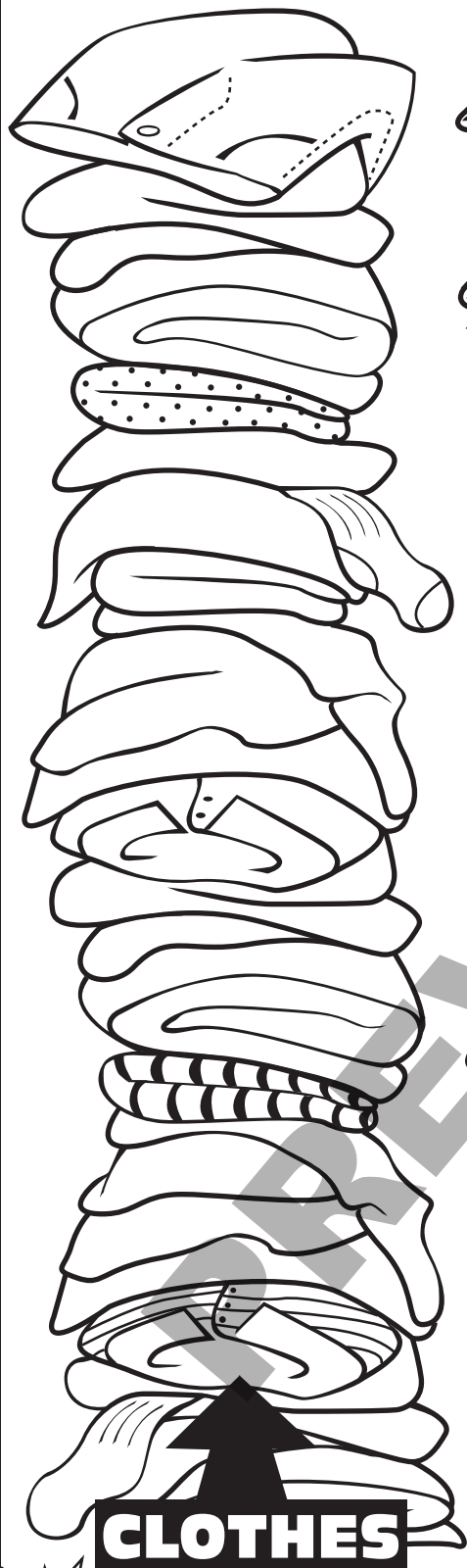
**Never light

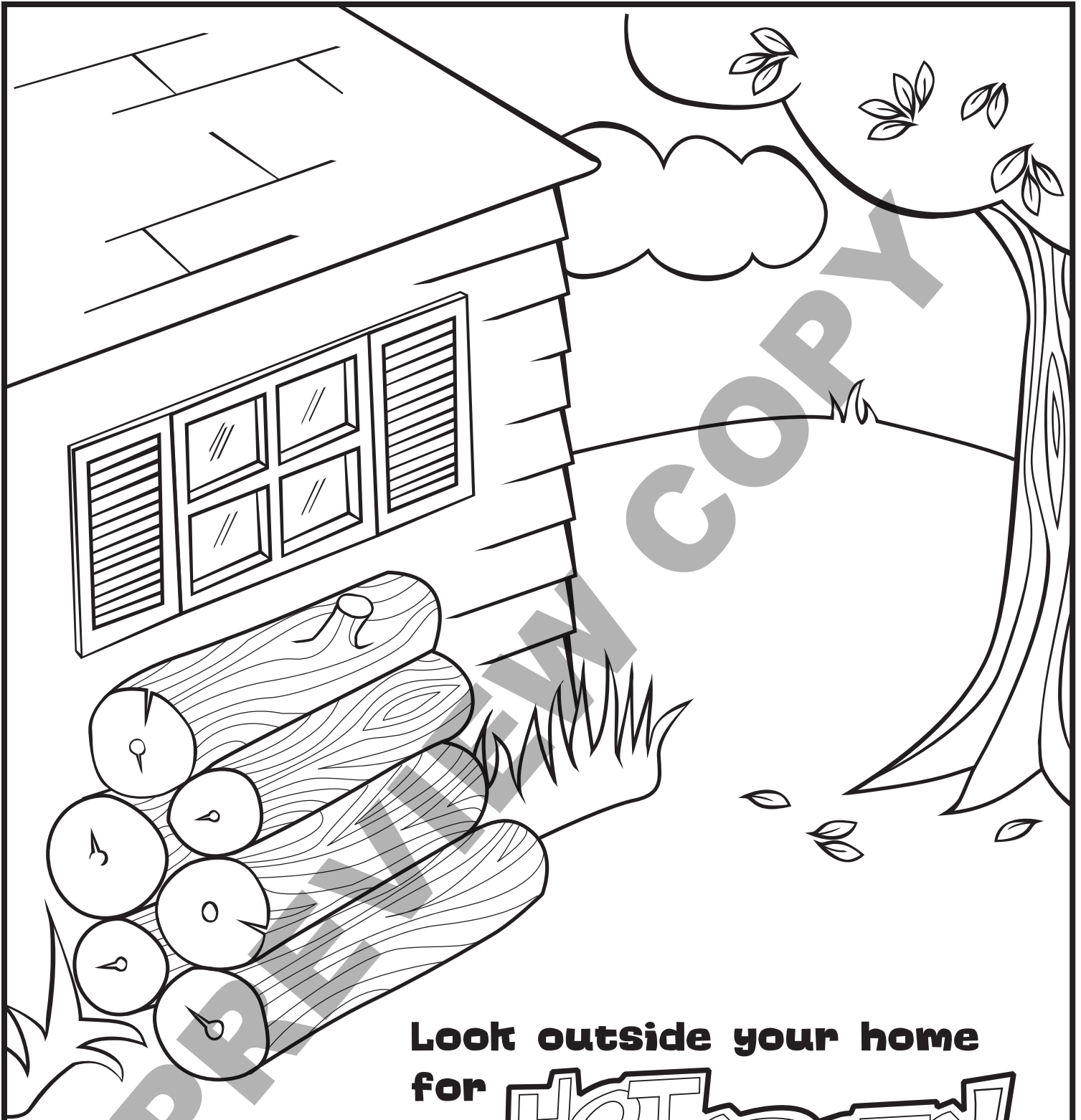

for

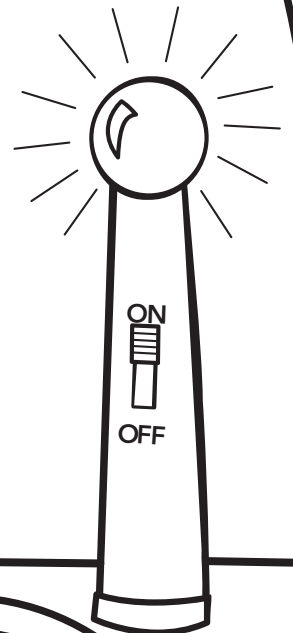
**HOT SPOTS!**

**HOT SPOT!**

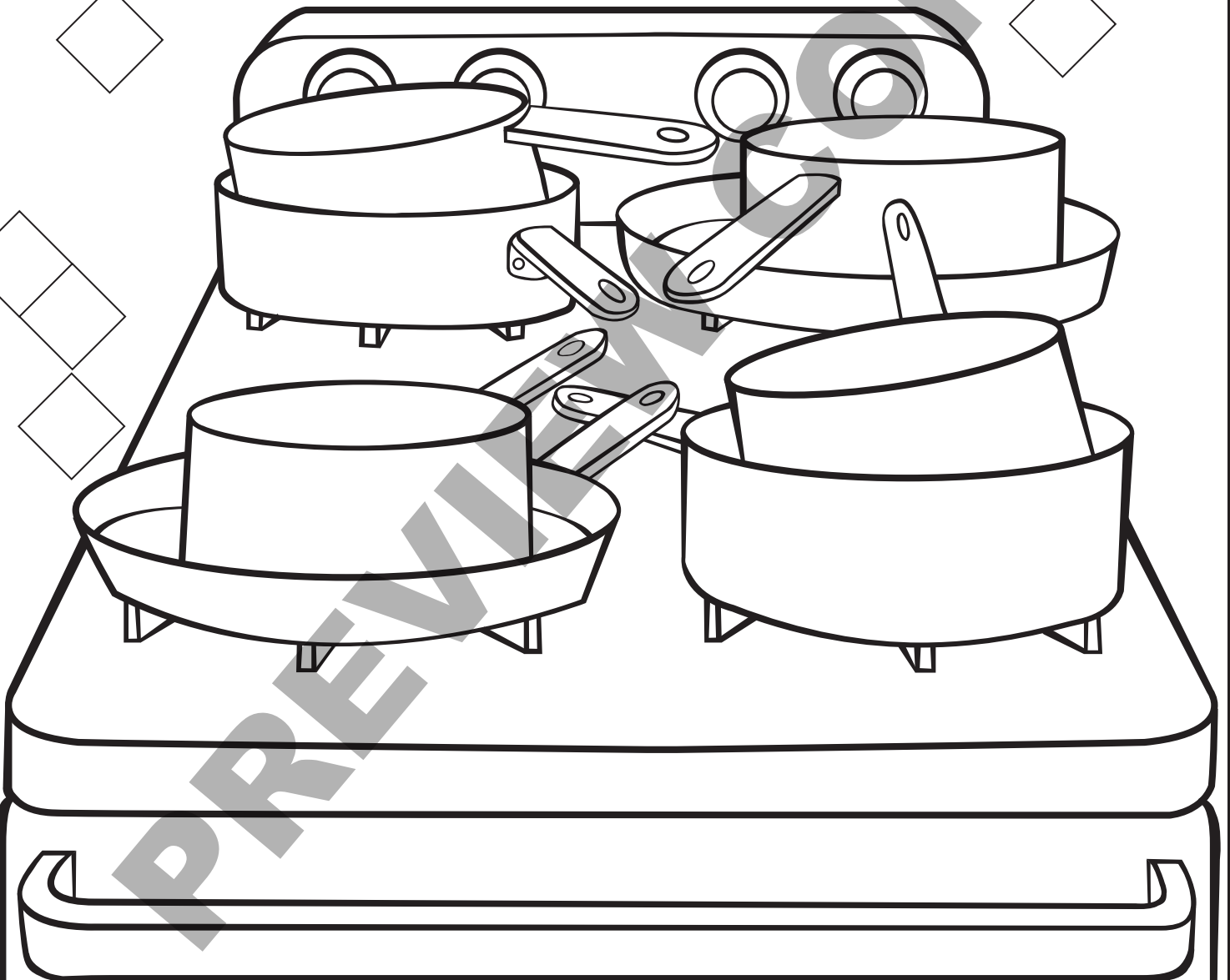
**Always use

and pans on a stove are**

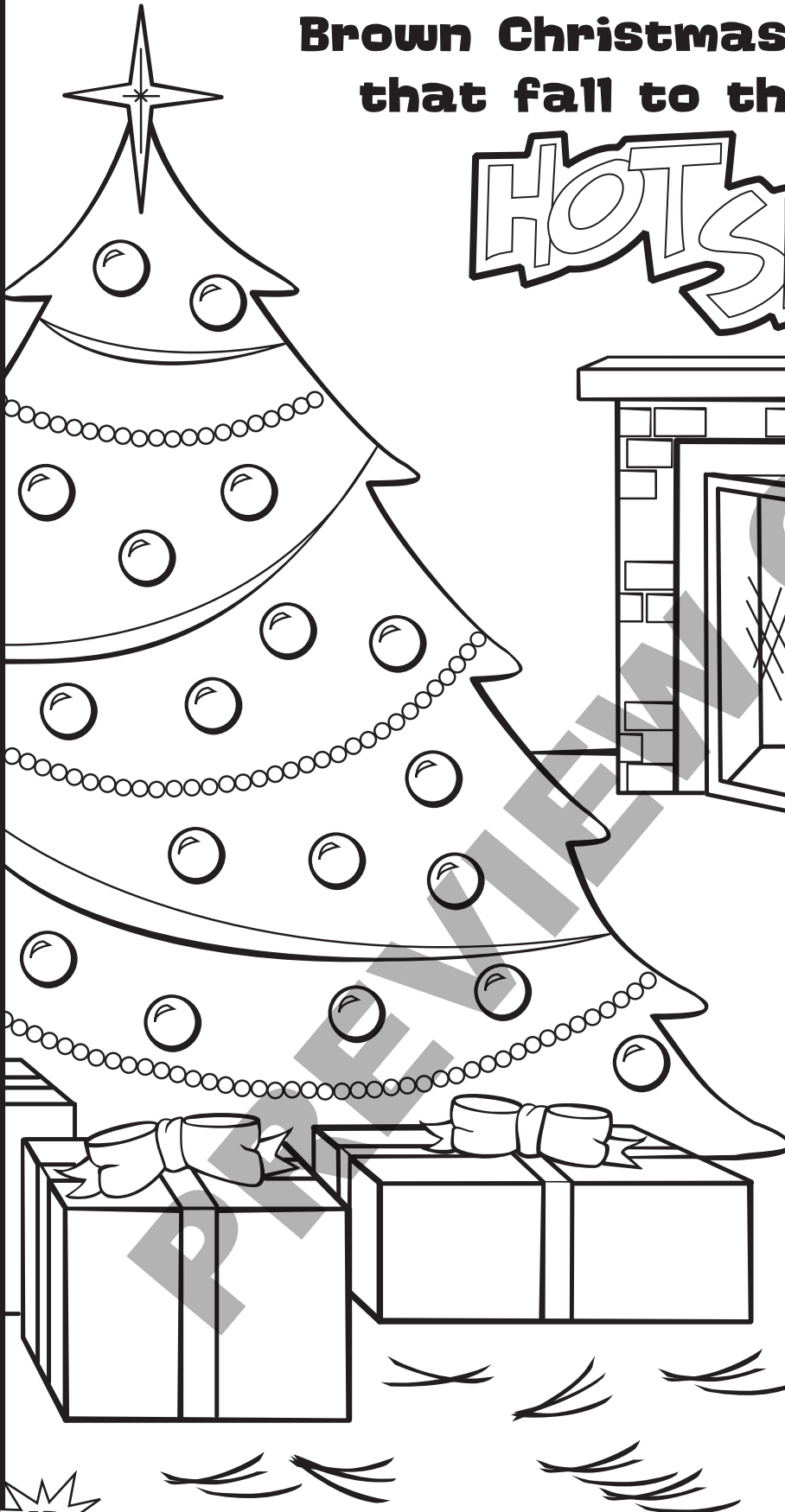
**HOT SPOTS!**

work are**

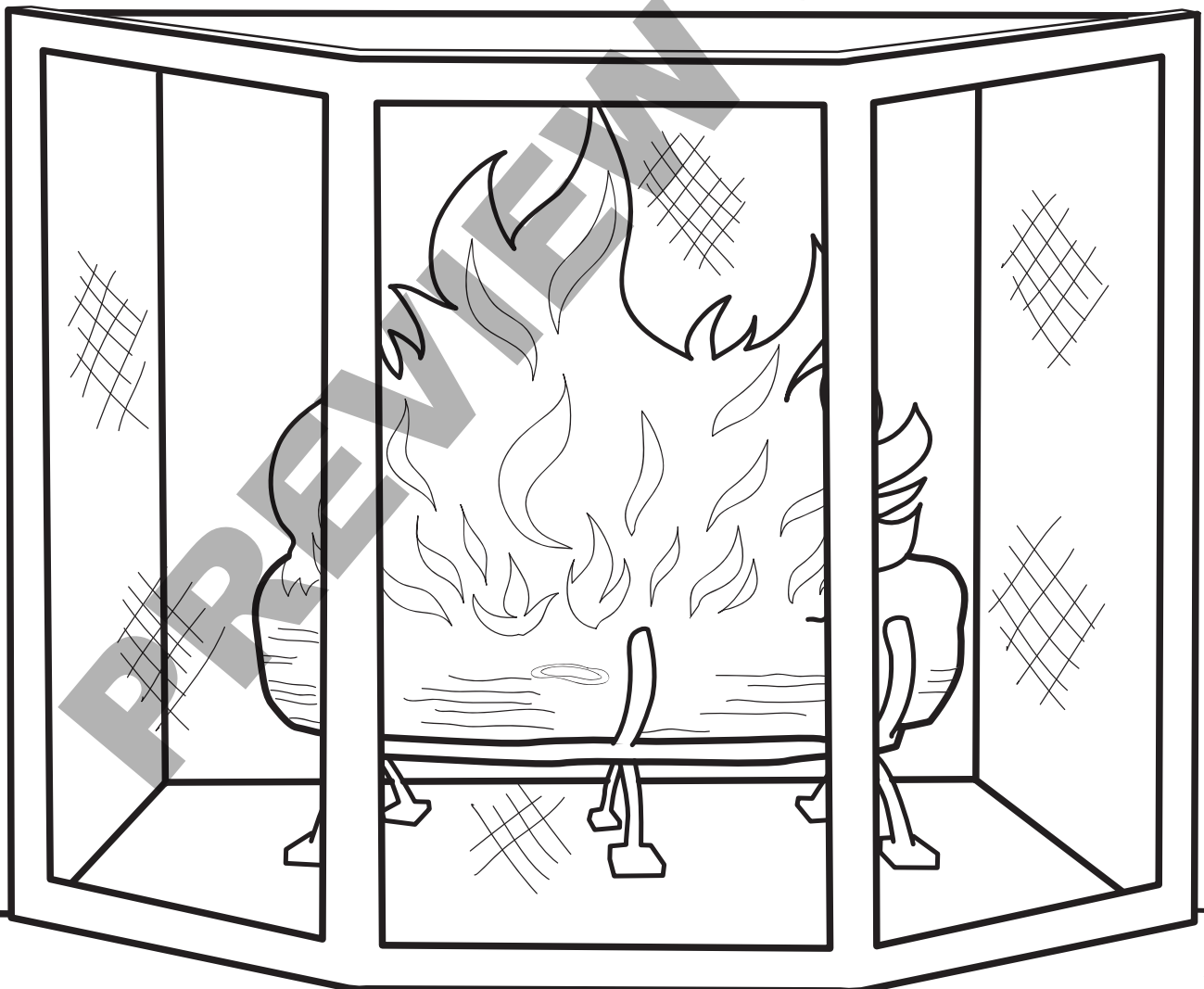

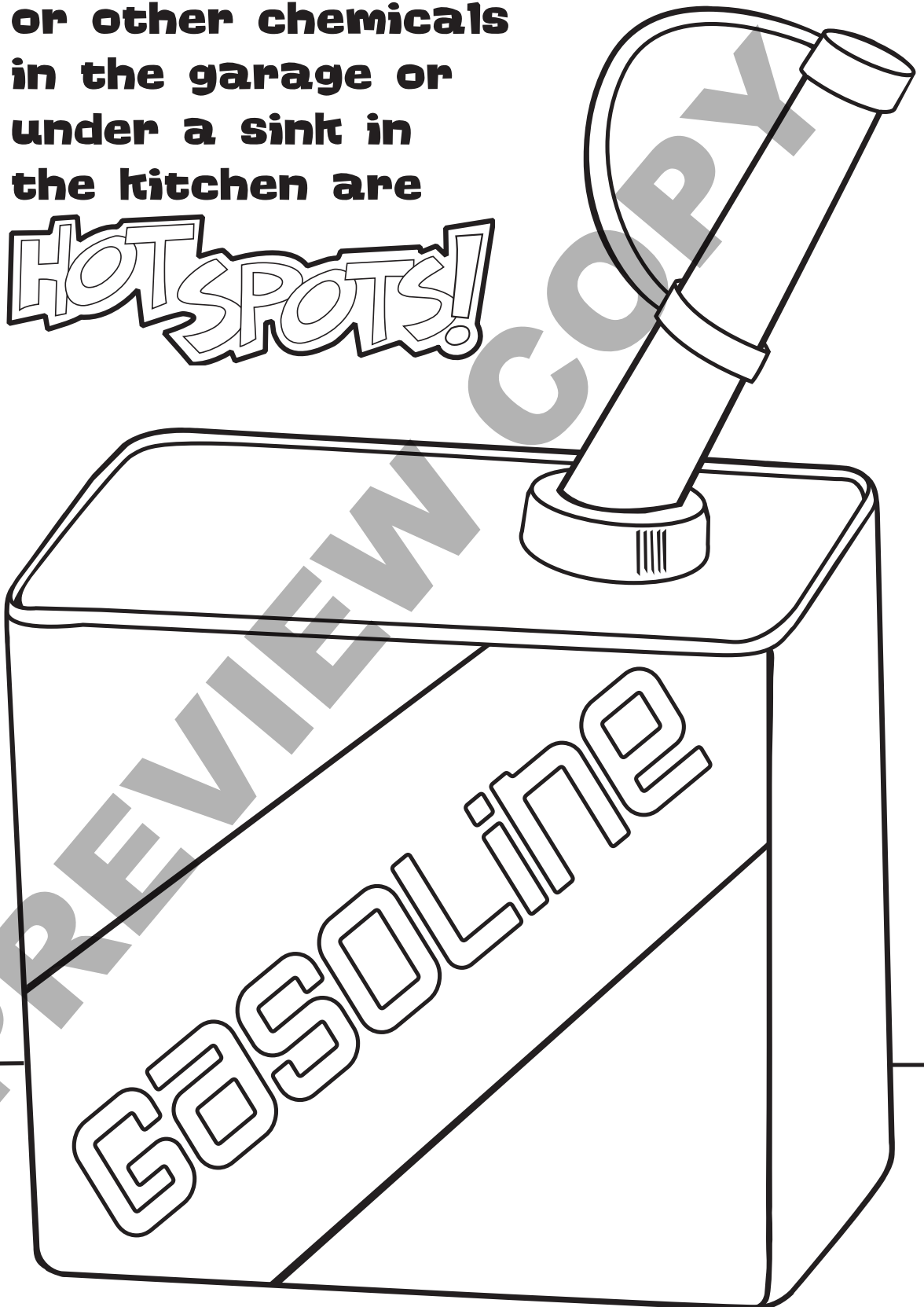
**Fireplaces in the home that do not have safety screens are**

the kitchen are**

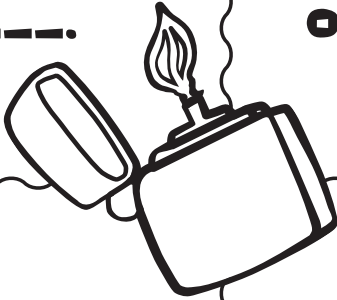

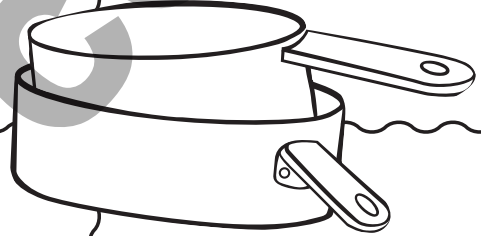
