S TO STAY SAFE WITH FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

- **THE EXTINGUISHERS OF FIRE EXTINGUISHERS**
 - A Ordinary materials like cloth, wood, and paper. B – Combustible and flammable liquids like grease and gasoline
 - C Electrical equipment like appliances, tools, or other equipment.
- (7) THE "FIRE TRIANGLE"
 - The "fire triangle" is oxygen, heat, and fuel. Remove any one to extinguish a fire.
- CONSIDER THE SIZE
 Select the largest fire extinguisher that you can safely and comfortably operate.
- CHOOSE ONE THAT HAS BEEN CERTIFIED
 Look for the "UL Listed" label on a fire
 extinguisher.
- READ THE GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS

 Know how to maintain and properly operate your specific extinguisher.
- REEP UP WITH MAINTENANCE
 - Regularly check the pressure level.
 - Make sure the can, hoses, and nozzles are not damaged, dented, or rusted.
 - Remove any dust, oil, or grease that might be on the outside of the fire extinguisher.
- STORE IT SAFELY

 Place your fire extinguisher so they are never more than 75 feet away.
- PLACEMENT

 Extinguishers need to be located along normal
- paths of travel.

 LEARN THE ACRONYM "PASS"
- P PULL THE PIN at the top of the extinguisher.
 A AIM at the base of the fire and not at the
 - flames. You must extinguish the fuel to the fire. S SQUEEZE the lever.
 - S SWEEP from side to side. Move the fire extinguisher back and forth until the fire is completely out.
- **CONTACT YOUR FIRE DEPARTMENT**They can provide fire extinguisher training and answer any questions.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER FACTS

Fires Are Deadly. Over 3,500 people die each year from fires, with those 85 and older being at the highest risk.

Early extinguishing is key. 93% of deaths and 95% of property damage occur after a fire grows beyond its early stage.

Fire extinguishers work 94% of the time and put out fires within two minutes.

Approximately 371,000 residential fires are put out each year by extinguishers.

Extinguishers are a low-cost investment. UL-rated extinguishers cost less than \$50.
